## Description of Program:

On Monday we will be meeting in the Highgate Mall Car park, on the grass area by the recycling bins, as part of our 'Give Back' campaign. The Mall donated a gift card to our raffle fundraiser, and this is our way of giving back and saying thanks, keeping our town tidy and looking after the environment. We will be picking up garbage along the grass area.

Youth are to wear full uniform and neckers and to bring water bottles. Please have the youth use the bathroom prior to attending. Parents are welcome and encouraged to stay to help out.

## Scouters' Notes: Points of concern/ safety issues:

- Road & car park - Youth are to stay on the grass at all times. All youth will be within eyesight and reach of youth at all times.
- Sharp/ dangerous objects. - All youth will be issued gloves. Youth are instructed to not pick up any sharp objects and to alert a Scouter/ adult if any dangerous objects are found.

## Scouters to bring:

- Garbage bags
- Gloves
- Garbage grabbers
- Safety vests

## Meeting will start with a safety brief:

- In bounds area - grass
- Out of bounds area - road, carpark
- Sharp and dangerous objects
- All youth to put on safety gloves and safety vests for visibility and protection
- Sign in and out sheets to ensure accurate Beaver numbers.

Parents have been asked to stay to help with numbers.

Nearest hospital: Public Hospital, 103 Main St, Highgate, E2V 1C7 - 2 mins from Highgate Mall

Contact Scouters will have first aid kits on hand.

Mall will be alerted to our presence.
